GREAT HALL - Opening mid-July

The Great Hall is a collaborative space dedicated to events, workshops, conferences, creation and work spaces. In the backyard of the Reford Gardens, the workshop built in the 70's has been entirely transformed. This new space is signed by a multidisciplinary team composed of Atelier Pierre Thibault, Rimouski architect Marie-Hélène Nollet and engineers Tetratech.

RESTAURANTS

VILLA ESTEVAN LODGE - Tuesday to Saturday, from noon to 2:30 pm

Once the Reford family's fishing camp, Estevan Lodge is now a heritage building where visitors can soak up history by visiting temporary and permanent exhibits, as well as enjoy a unique dining experience in the Villa Estevan Lodge restaurant.

LE BUFTON - Friday to Tuesday, from 9 am to 4:30 pm

Located in the Visitor Centre at the entrance to the Reford Gardens, Le Bufton is a bistro-refreshment bar offering a luncheon menu inspired by the garden's vegetables and local flavours.

GARDEN CAFÉ - Wednesday to Sunday, from 10 am to 5 pm

Located in the gardens adjacent to Estevan Lodge, the Garden Café offers visitors a simple but delicious menu: sandwiches, ice cream bars and refreshments. Garden gazebos are located at the heart of the Reford Gardens.

THE INTERNATIONAL GARDEN FESTIVAL 23RD EDITION -**ADAPTATION**

The International Garden Festival is the largest contemporary garden festival in North America. Since its creation in 2000, nearly 200 gardens have been presented in situ at Grand-Métis and in extramural locations in Canada and abroad. The Festival takes place on a site adjacent to the historic gardens, allowing for a dialogue between history and modernity, between conservation, tradition and innovation. Each year, the event features twenty or more creations by architects, landscape architects and designers from various disciplines. The events is presented with the financial support of the Canada Council for the Arts, Canadian Heritage and the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec.
